Grav Is Appointed Extension Forester

Appointment of John L. Gray to succeed Robert W. Graeber as exten-sion forester at State College was an-nounced this week by Dr. I. O. Schaub, director of the Agricultural Extension Service.

Graeber retired effective January 1 after having served as extension forester since 1925.

Gray, a native of Fairfax County, Virginia, received a B. S. in forestry at Pennsylvania State College in 1941 and a Master's degree in the same field at Yale University in 1942. He served as a timber spotter in Arkansas for seven months before joining the Army Air Corps in November,

Released from active duty in September, 1944, Gray accepted a post as logging superintendent for a concern in Loretta, Wisconsin. A year later, in October, 1945, he came to North Carolina to become assistant extension forester.
