

Gray Is Appointed Extension Forester

Appointment of John L. Gray to succeed Robert W. Graeber as extension forester at State College was announced this week by Dr. I. O. Schaub, director of the Agricultural Extension Service.

Graeber retired effective January 1 after having served as extension forester since 1925.

Gray, a native of Fairfax County, Virginia, received a B. S. in forestry at Pennsylvania State College in 1941 and a Master's degree in the same field at Yale University in 1942. He served as a timber spotter in Arkansas for seven months before joining the Army Air Corps in November, 1942.

Released from active duty in September, 1944, Gray accepted a post as logging superintendent for a concern in Loreta, Wisconsin. A year later, in October, 1945, he came to North Carolina to become assistant extension forester.

He is a member of Alpha Zeta, Xi Sigma Pi, and the Society of American Foresters.

Graeber, whose retirement was prompted by ill health, was a pioneer in the development of North Carolina's farm woodlands. He was instrumental in getting a Department of Forestry established in the State College School of Agriculture and was one of the first to take the course which it offered. He also set up several hundred forestry demonstrations throughout North Carolina and kept detailed records on each.

He has conducted forestry educational meetings in every county in the State and has trained county agents to give practical assistance to farmers in forest planting, thinning, pruning, timber scaling, selective harvest, and marketing.

Increase In Telephone Rates Is Now Necessary
