## **Superior Court**

Term Concluded Late Thursday

The April term of Superior Court, in session here last week, was con-cluded late Thursday evening, follow-ing the trial of Alton Pierce, charged with assault with a deadly weapon.

At the conclusion of this trial, Solicitor Walter Cohoon took a nol pros in a robbery case and requested that the hearing of Henry Mathews, charged with assault with a deadly weapon be set for hearing at the October term of Court.

Pierce, charged with assaulting Mathews, was found not guilty after a jury had deliberated for about 45 minutes.

John H. Phillips, Negro, who entered a plea of guilty to a charge of assault with a deadly weapon was sentenced to the roads for a period of 12 to 18 months.

Judge Chester Morris, who presided over the term, sentenced Troy Elliott, found guilty on two counts, to 12 by USDA nutritionists as excellent months on the roads for possession sources of proteins, the home agent

Eight criminal cases, in all, were continued to the October term of Superior Court as was 17 civil cases listed on the April term calendar.

Count was ordered adjourned by Judge Morris at two o'clock on last Friday afternoon.


