The work not only enables the veterans to earn much needed money but also is valuable as occupational therapy.

Poppies will be sold on the streets of Hertford and throughout the county by volunteer workers from the Auxiliary and Girl Scouts, Mrs. White said. Contributions received for the little red memorial flowers will go entirely into the rehabilitation and child welfare funds of the Legion and Auxiliary.
