Help Build Hertford

The Weekly urges all the citizens of Hertford to adopt an intelligent plan of community cooperation. This does not involve the careless boosting that ignores facts or the degenerating pessimism that depreciates everything. It merely requires that the citizens of Hertford realize that the combined efforts of all neighbors and friends will definitely improve our town.

One of the necessities for such improvement is a sound business structure upon which to rest other ornaments. The trade-at-home policy, as often advocated by this newspaper, is a cardinal principle of community loyalty. It applies to sellers as well as to buyers and involves the use of money for improving Hertford as well as spending it within municipal limits.

In addition, our citizens should compare Hertford with other communities and, if possible, see that we acquire as many advantages as others. Moreover, an eye should be kept on our living conditions and social organizations in the hope of securing a fuller life for those who make their homes in our midst.

"Let's Reduce Taxes"

There is always a campaign for the reduction of taxes. Everybody wants the "government" to spend money on favored propositions and, at the same time, reduce taxes.

The way to reduce taxes is simple, if that is what the people want. Let government eliminate all activities that are not essential to the functions of government. This will cost a great many people their jobs, but it will cut the cost of government and, thereby, reduce taxes.

Oil And War

On one occasion, during the recent war, there was not enough fuel oil in the New York area to fill the bunkers of the battleship Missouri, according to a statement recently made by Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, at San Francisco.

Deploring the lack of oil storage facilities around the world, the chief architect of our victory over Japan said that this might explain "our interest in Middle East oil." Moreover, he pointed out that we are using oil today at a faster rate than we did during the war, and that if a conflict should begin, he doesn't believe that there is enough oil in the Western Hemisphere to meet our needs.

The Admiral revealed that only one storage in the world meets the needs of the Navy. This is the underground storage on the island of Oahu, which has a capacity of six million barrels of fuel oil.

Plan For Atomic Defense

News that mock atomic-attacks will be used to msp emergency civil defense programs for American cities seems to establish the possibility of such attacks in the event of another war.

Civilian defense officials point out that the practice program, planned in Washington, Chicago and Seattle, does not mean that an emergency is any nearer than it was before. All that the officials are trying to do is to get ideas for the development of an emergency plan, which, in time, will be replaced by a more permanent program.

Communists Easy Promisers

The Communists in China have promised Tibet regional autonomy in return for allegiance peacefully given to Peiping and suggest that this step is necessary if the Tibetan people wish to avoid "unnecessary losses."

There is nothing to indicate that the Tibetan forces will be able to prevent Communist penetration but, certainly, if they are sensible, they do not put much confidence in the offer of autonomy. The Communists promise anything to get into a country but, once in, they move toward domination.
