

### Deadline For Vet Training Courses Set July 25, 1951

The Deadline for starting GI Bill courses of education and training for most veterans is exactly a year away, on July 25, 1951, Veterans Administration reminds veterans.

That date, established by law, should be kept in mind, VA added, when World War II veterans make future plans for schooling or training at Government expense.

This coming fall school term, for example, will be the final fall term when most veterans may enter or re-enter GI Bill training. They still may begin their studies later, so long as it's before the 1951 date.

Most veterans actually must be in training by the deadline if they want to continue afterwards. VA will consider a veteran to be in training, even though he has temporarily interrupted his course for summer vacation or for other reasons beyond his control.

Once he completes or discontinues his program of training after the 1951 date, he may not start another course. Also, he must meet these requirements:

He will be expected to pursue his training "continuously until completion, except for conditions which normally would cause interruption by any student."

He may change his educational objective "only while in training and then for reasons satisfactory to the Administrator."

The July 25, 1951, cut-off date does not apply to veterans discharged after July 25, 1947. They have four years from the date of discharge in which to begin GI Bill training. They must, however, finish training by July 25, 1956.

Those who enlisted or re-enlisted under the Armed Forces Voluntary Recruitment Act (between October 6, 1945, and October 5, 1946) have four years from the end of their enlistment or re-enlistment period in which to start training, and nine years from that time in which to complete.

A new law, permitting a veteran to change for the first time from one general field of GI Bill study to another merely by applying for it, will not be in effect after the cut-off date.

### Driving While Drunk Costs Many Drivers License Revocation

Drunken driving accounted for more revocations of driver's licenses in June than any other one offense, the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles reports.

A total of 769 persons were convicted of drunken driving last month in the State as compared with 581 convicted on the same count in June of 1949. Fifty-three of the defendants were convicted on second offense.

Other convictions were as follows: Two offenses of reckless driving, 19; speeding over 75 miles per hour, 59; two offenses of speeding over 55 miles per hour, 51; larceny of automobile, 28; manslaughter, 2; transporting liquor, 68; unsatisfied judgment, 16; incompetency, 4; habitual violator, 19; failure to maintain proof of financial responsibility, 148.

Speeding topped the list with 3,069 cases. Failure to have driver's license was second with 1,177. Faulty equipment was listed in 686 cases and improper lights in 291. Twenty-five persons were found guilty of passing a school bus, 487 ran through a red light, 92 were driving on the wrong side of the road, 57 were passing on a hill, 59 were driving too close for safety, 27 failed to dim lights and 38 failed to give right-of-way.

Revocations for drunken driving brought to 1,044 the total of revocations.

Forty-five persons were convicted of driving after their licenses were revoked and 11 of driving after license suspended. Two persons were found guilty of hit and run charges, involving personal injury, and two hit and run, involving property damage.

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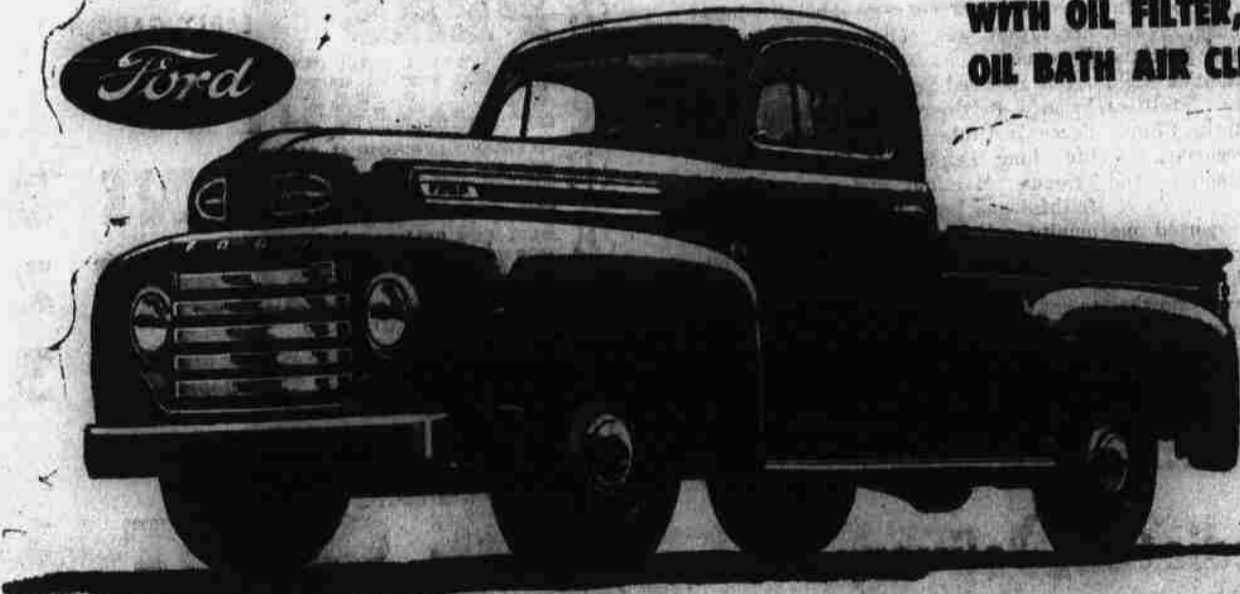
