**FREE IMMUNIZATION CLINICS**

The Pasquotank-Perquimans-Camden-Chowan District Health Department will hold clinics at the points and on the dates and hours stated below.

At these clinics we will be prepared to do the following work:

- (1) TYPHOID VACCINATION: Three doses, a week apart, are best unless you had this vaccine last year. If taken each year, one dose is sufficient. FREE!
- (2) DIPHTHERIA (ALONE): Two doses a month apart should be given. N. C. STATE LAW REQUIRES IMMUNIZATION OF EVERY CHILD AGAINST DIPHTHERIA BEFORE THE FIRST YEAR OF LIFE. FREE!
- (3) WHOOPING COUGH (ALONE): Three or four doses at intervals of 1 to 3 weeks should be given. N. C. STATE LAW REQUIRES THAT EVERY CHILD SHALL BE IMMUNIZED AGAINST WHOOPING COUGH BEFORE THE FIRST YEAR OF LIFE. FREE!
- (4) DIPHTHERIA-WHOOPING COUGH (COMBINED): Two doses four weeks apart, followed by 2 additional doses Whooping Cough. FREE!
- (5) BOOSTER dose of (a) Typhoid (b) Diphtheria-Whooping Cough. FREE!
- (6) SMALLPOX: Should be given in the first 6 months of life. Repeat every 8 to 10 years. N. C. LAW REQUIRES SUCCESSFUL VACCINATION AGAINST SMALLPOX BEFORE A CHILD MAY ENTER SCHOOL IN THIS STATE. FREE!
- (7) SCHICK TEST: For susceptibility to Diphtheria. FREE!
- (8) TUBERCULIN TEST: Should be given to all contacts of active cases, particularly children. You MUST come to your Health Office on the third day for reading. FREE!

A good thing to do is give three doses of triple vaccine (monthly intervals) against Diphtheria, Whooping Cough and Tetanus, (Lock Jaw). This triple vaccine costs you 20c per dose.

If you go to your private Doctor for these services, please ask him for a certificate giving your name, child's name and age, your address and vaccines given with dates, and mail to the Health Department in your county—this is for our records.
