Bankers Announce **Subject For Contest**

Joseph H. Wolfe, executive secretary of the North Carolina Bankers Association, has announced that "Green Pastures, Their Place In the Economy of North Carolina," will be the general subject for the 1951 Agricultural Speaking Contest for high school students in North Carolina.

For the sixth year the contest will be sponsored by the N. C. Bankers Association in cooperation with N. C. State College and local agricultural groups.' A separate contest is being sponsored by the N. C. Bankers Association for Negro high school stu-dents, plans for which will be an-

All white students in North Carolina's 683 high schools, in grades 9 to 12, are eligible to participate. Each must write his own speech, but may receive informational help from any source. A kit of subject material will be made available to all high schools, through the county agent's office.

Maximum time permitted for each speech is 12 minutes. General organization and content will count 50 points, and elements of delivery will count 50. The latter includes correct English, 15 points; ease and poise before audience, 15; gestures, 10 and voice, 10.

April 6, 1951, is the date for the State finals in Raleigh.




