

Indians Lose To Sunbury Girls Win Opening Game

Perquimans High School opened its 1950 basketball season at Sunbury last Friday night with the Perquimans Squaws trouncing the Sunbury girls 40-33 while the Indians lost the opener to the Sunbury boys by a two-point margin 32-30.

In the preliminary game between the girls, Marvina White, with 16 points, led her teammates in scoring the opening victory. Symons tallied 10 points, Saunders got six and J. Yagel had eight. Morgan was high point maker for the Sunbury girls.

The Squaws held an 11-10 advantage at the close of the first period and maintained a lead throughout the contest. Half time score was 18-14.

In the boys' contest, the Indians, fresh from playing football, had difficulty in finding the range of the basket and missed many easy shots. Sunbury took an 8-5 lead in the first period and held this advantage throughout the contest. Half time score was 18-15. Only in the final period did Perquimans outscore Sunbury, the Indians racking up nine points while Sunbury collected seven.

Tilley was high point man for Perquimans with nine; Thach had 8, Sumner 6, Cannon four, and Morris 2. Walker scored one point.

Coach Fearing used 10 players in the contest, starting off with Thach and Tilley at forwards, Towe at center, Sumner and Wulf at guards. Cannon, Walker, Morris, Williams and Lane were used as substitutes during the game. Ward, with 12 points, was high man for the Sunbury team.

BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$175,000 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF PERQUIMANS

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education of the County of Perquimans, acting for the Perquimans County School Administrative Unit, has determined that it is necessary to provide certain additional school facilities in said unit such as are described in Section I of this bond order, in order that the public schools in said County may be maintained, as a part of the system of public schools of the State of North Carolina, for the term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and that it will be necessary to expend for such purposes not less than \$175,000 in addition to any other available moneys, and have requested the Board of Commissioners to issue bonds of the County of Perquimans to raise such sum: NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Perquimans as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Perquimans has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that the Perquimans County School Administrative Unit erect new school facilities consisting of schoolhouses, physical education and vocational education buildings and lunch rooms, and erect additions to and alter and reconstruct such existing school facilities, and acquire land and purchase furnishings and equipment required for such school plant facilities, in order that the public schools in said County may be maintained as a part of the system of public schools of the State of North Carolina, for the term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purposes not less than \$175,000, in addition to any moneys which have been or will hereafter be made available from other sources to finance such additional school facilities.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to finance the erection of such new school plant facilities and for the erection of additions to and the reconstruction and

alteration of such existing school plant facilities and the acquisition of such land and the purchase of such furnishings and equipment, bonds of the County of Perquimans are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds authorized by this bond order shall be One Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000).

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the County debt of the County of Perquimans has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This bond order shall be effective when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing bond order was finally passed on the 27th day of November, 1950, and was first published on the 1st day of December, 1950. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said bond order must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

PERQUIMANS COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that a Special Election will be held in the County of Perquimans, North Carolina, on January 6, 1951, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said county, the following proposition:

Shall the qualified voters of the County of Perquimans approve the bond order entitled "Bond Order Authorizing the issuance of \$175,000 School Bonds of the County of Perquimans," which was adopted by the Board of Commissioners on November 27, 1950, and which authorizes bonds of the County of Perquimans of the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$175,000 to finance the erection of new school plant facilities consisting of schoolhouses, physical education and vocational buildings and lunch rooms, and the erection of additions to and the alteration and reconstruction of such existing school facilities, and the acquisition of land, and purchase of furnishings and equipment required for such school

plant facilities, in the Perquimans County School Administrative Unit, in order that the public schools in said County may be maintained as a part of the system of public schools of the state of North Carolina, and also authorizes the levy of an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds authorized thereby; and approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of said bonds?

The polls for the election will be open at the hour of 6:30 o'clock A. M., and will close at the hour of 6:30 P. M., Eastern Standard Time. The election will be held at the same polling places at which the last election was held in Perquimans County for the election of members of the General Assembly.

The Registration Books shall be opened for the registration of voters at 9:00 o'clock A. M., on Saturday, December 9, 1950, and shall be closed at Sunset on Saturday, December 23, 1950. On each day (Sundays excepted) during such period, the Registrar for each election precinct in the County will keep the book open between the hours of 9:00 o'clock A. M., and sunset for the registration of voters in such election precinct. On each Saturday during such period each Registrar will attend at the polling place in his election precinct between the hours of 9 o'clock A. M., and sun-
