Develops Through Ages

While we do not know as much as we would like to know about the early history of the human race, it is apparent that somewhere, sometime, the tribes of the prehistoric ages developed a primitive plow, which led to the cultivation of the soil and made it possible for men to live in permanent, populous communities.

Agriculture has made tremendous strides since the first man fashioned a plow from some forked tree. It is a long way from this tree-type of plow, which is pictured on Egyptian monuments, to the modern plow used in this country. We must remember that, in some backward areas of the world, the tilling of the soil continues in primitive fashion.

Even in the most advanced countries, where civilization has developed, its full benefits have been slow to reach the tillers of the soil. This naturally resulted from isolation but countries with good roads, telephones, radios and newspapers, exhibit an accelerated progress in agriculture.

Because modern agricultural machinery costs money, it is not possible for the average farmer, in many instances, to take advantage of the developments of science. It is necessary for farmers to foster mutual cooperation and, through farm organizations, to make available to all members, the use of the best and most modern machines.

Another development in modern agriculture is the appearance of the specialist. This often occurs when some individual purchases modern farm machinery and makes it available to other farmers, either by rental or by undertaking a specific task for a specified amount. This practice

should be encouraged wherever necessary to make modern machinery available to the farmers of any community.

Perquimans FFA Wins In Judging Contest

In a livestock judging contest held at Gatesville on Thursday, April 19, the Perquimans County High School FFA teams won top honors in judging dairy cattle, beef cattle, and hogs.

The dairy cattle judging team was composed of Billy Morris Benton, Eugene Blyce, and Robert Morris Winslow, while the team judging beef cattle and hogs was composed of Clarence Chappell, Jr., John Mansfield, and Bobby Smith.

Other schools taking part in the livestock judging contest at Gatesville were Central, Weicksville, Griggs, Moyock, Gatesville, Chowan, Sunbury and Hobbsville.

ADDITION—HERTFORD COLORED ELEMENTARY SCHOOL Separate proposals will be received for the general construction, electrical, plumbing, and heating work.

Plans and specifications and bidding blanks are on file at the office of James W. Griffith, Jr., Architect, Greenville, N. C., and may be obtained from him upon deposit of Twenty-Five dollars (\$25.00). Bidders who submit a bona fide and reasonable bid will be refunded the full amount of the deposit upon return of same in good condition within five (5) days after letting date. Cost of printing and handling will be retained on all others.

All Contractors are hereby notified that any and all pertinent provisions of the General Statutes of North Carolina governing the letting of public building contracts, subsequent amendments and enactments pertaining to the licensing, registration and regulation of their respective professions and trades will be observed in the receipt of bids and the award of the work. All bidders must be duly licensed as Contractors by the State of North Carolina at the time of submitting their bid and as provided by G. S. 105-54, Subsection B, before undertaking to execute any contract.

A bidders' certified check for 5% of the bid must accompany each bid. (In lieu thereof a bidder may offer a certified check for 2% of the bid plus a bid bond of 3% of the bid.) As required by law, all certified checks submitted with proposals shall be drawn on a Bank or Trust Company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Said deposit to be retained by the Owner as liquidated damages in event of a failure ten days after the award or to give satisfactory surety as required by law.

A performance bond is required in an amount equal to 100% of the contract price conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and upon the payment of all persons supplying labor and furnishing materials

for construction of the project. No informal bids will be received. The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to waive informalities.
