

Weed Control Tests Being Made In County

Two result demonstrations on pre-emergence weed control in peanuts were started in Perquimans County on May 28, it was reported today by the County Agent's office. One of the tests is on Linwood O. Winslow's farm near Belvidere and the other on George Baker's farm near Woodville. Three different materials were used in each test, and 100th of an acre (two rows 62 feet long) was used for each material and a similar amount was treated in both demonstrations. A check-it was reported by the county agent.

The experiments are being conducted in cooperation with the State College Experiment Station. The materials were applied on the sixth day after the peanuts were planted.
