THE NEIGHBORHOOD

International Sunday School Lesson for July 22nd, 1951.

Memory Selection: Verily, I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of these my brethren, even these least, ye did it unto me,"-Matthew

Lesson Text: Romans 12: 9-21: 13: 8-10.

Many of us do not find it so difficult to love our families, our relatives and our friends, but we feel that it just is impossible for us to "love" our neighbors. They are not even likable, we say. We don't approve of what they are, say or do.

Jesus said the commandment to "Love Thy neighbor as thyself" was second only to the first and greatest of all commandments, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God . . ." When asked the question, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied with the parable of the Good Samaritan, which teaches that anyone who needs our help is our neighbor, whether he lives next door, on the other side of the tracks, or on the other side of the world.

Paul picks up this teaching of Jesus and repeats it in the twelfth chapter of Romans. This chapter reminds us very much of parts of the Sermon on the Mount. Paul has much to say about love here, and throughout his writings. He felt that the basic ingredient for a Christian life is lovelove for God and consequent love for

The twelfth chapter of Romans is a discussion of the duties of a Christian as they apply to himself and his fellowman. The thirteenth chapter outlines the Christian's civic duties. Both chapters are summed up by Paul in his repetition of the exhortation of Jesus, "Thou shalt love they neighbor as thysalf." It is interesting to learn that this commandment was not original with Jesus It can be found. original with Jesus. It can be found in Leviticus 19:18—another proof that Jesus knew the Scriptures.

How does Paul say the Christian should get along with his neighbor? He underlines and emphasizes the word, "love." If you love, you won't be selfish. If you love, you won't be jealous, or envious, or covetous, or suspicious. You will want to weep with your neighbor when he weeps and sincerely rejoice with him when there's an occasion for rejoicing. You will be forgiving, forgetting the unintentional slight or wrong he has done

will be forgiving, forgetting the unintentional slight or wrong he has done you. If we will remember the words of Jesus, who said, "Do unto others as ye would that men should do unto you," we could live peaceably and happily with our neighbors.

Who are your neighbors, They are not hecessarily those who live on either side of you, and yet these are included. They are the underprivileged who need your help and influence in bettering their condition in life. They are the children who are on the borderline of juvenile delinquency in your community. They are the strangers in need of a friend. Are you a neighbor to these? The responsibility for their welfare is partly yours.



What can you do to help? You, as a Christian, can show a sympathetic interest in them. Often, just the knowledge that there is someone who is interested, someone who cares, can make all the difference in the world to those who feel neglected and despendent. It often supplies the needed apark to a new start in life.

To live peaceably in one's neighborhood, the Christian should avoid suspiciou, recentment and the repetition of gossip. Henry Van Dyke gave good advice when he said: "There are two good twice which ought to be written on every agast: Never believe anything bad about anybody unless you positively know it to be true: Never tell seen what you know about it, unless you feel that it is abosittely necessary and that God is lightning as you tell it."
