No Confidence In Soviet

The democratic governments of the world are convinced that the present drive that emanates from Moscow, under the guise of wanting to establish a solid and permanent peace, is closely connected with the arms drive now underway in the United States and Western Europe and with the hope that the free people can be persuaded that Russia is anxious to live in peace, so that they will lighten up on the rearmament of the free world.

One of the latest proposals to come from the Communist headquarters is the suggestion that a five-power conference be held, with the aim of a "peace pact" to be signed by the Soviet Union, Communist China, the United States, Great Britain and France. Demand for such a conference has appeared regularly in the Communist area during the recent weeks.

The trouble with such a conference, or any pact agreed upon at such a parley, is that the Western world would have no confidence in the good faith of the Communist powers. Until the Russians, and their satellites, demonstrate by concrete actions and prolonged behavior that they plan no aggression and sincerely seek peace, there is no prospect of a satisfactory conference or a dependable treaty of any kind.

Inspect Motor Vehicles

The need for a careful inspection of the condition of automobiles that use our highways at high speeds comes from another state, where a man was fatally injured by an automobile driven by a boy who had received his driving permit less than an hour before.

Police said that the car had defective brakes, no front license plate, no parking lights, and a defective rear tire. The plastic portion of the steering wheel was also missing and the driver had to control the vehicle by turning the small metal frame of the steering wheel. The boy told the police that he bought the car for \$75.

While some states provide for a rigid inspection of automobiles, other states make no such requirement. There is always pressure upon legislators not to provide for examinations because many people do not want to be bothered with annual inspections. Moreover, owners of defective cars do not like the compulsory repair bill which inevitably follows examinations.

The safety of those who use the highway, whether in motor vehicles or on foot, is in danger every time a defective motor vehicle operates on the roads. Defective lights and brakes that will not stop a car promptly are probably the major defects.

There are enough risks on the highways of the nation without deliberately permitting the use of vehicles that are mere contraptions even when carefully operated. Something must be done to cut down the fatalities on our roads and it might be a good idea for the states of the union to insist upon regular inspections for the purpose of eliminating jalopies, rattlers, and better cars which have serious defects.
