

Fruit Rate High
On USDA Food List

Apples, raisins, oranges, and tangerines are the U. S. Department of Agriculture's featured plentiful foods for January. Mrs. Nina B. White, county home demonstration agent for the State College Extension Service, said this week.

Because of their special abundance, these four items top USDA's monthly plentiful foods list for the Southeast. Apple production is an estimated 26 per cent higher than last season, the home agent explained, while raisin production is up 67 per cent. The early and mid-season orange crop in Florida is record-large, and there'll be more tangerines this season than last, according to USDA crop forecasts.

Other foods on the January list for this area are pork and pork products, heavy turkeys, hens, dry milk, cottage cheese, canned tuna, frozen fish, dry beans, canned and frozen orange and grapefruit juices, honey, rice, peaches, and almonds.

The rice crop for 1951 is forecast at a record 44.6 million hundred-weight. Heavy supplies of frozen concentrated and canned orange juice from the new pack will be available in January, USDA reports. The home agent also pointed out that stocks of canned grapefruit juice are about four times those of a year ago.
