**PROCEEDINGS OF COMMISSIONERS**

February 4, 1952.

At a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Perquimans County, held at the Court House on the first Monday, the 4th day of February, 1952, present and presiding, A. T. Lane, chairman, with Commissioners R. S. Chappell, E. B. Hollowell, William C. Chappell and E. A. Turner. Absent, none.

On motion, the Commissioners approved a petition requesting that the State Highway and Public Works Commission take over and maintain that certain road set out in petition, beginning in the village of New Hope on the Hertford-New Hope road and running near the New Hope churchyard to the home of Mrs. John Foster. Upon motion duly passed upon an unfavorable report having been made by the driveway committee as to creating driveway on east side of the Agriculture Building. The request for said driveway made at the January, 1952, meeting is rejected.

On motion ordered \$1,500.00 is to be transferred temporarily from general county fund to capital outlay fund to permit payment for school buses.

On motion, ordered that W. J. Saunders be granted peddler's license to sell Raleigh products.

On motion ordered that rent on colored Agriculture Building be raised to \$15.00 a month, beginning July 1, 1952.

Chas. E. Johnson tendered his resignation as County Attorney for

Perquimans County, to be effective as of February 4, 1952, and on motion and with regrets it was accepted.

The application of Silas M. Whedbee for County Attorney was presented to the Board. After due consideration he was unanimously elected to fill the vacancy made by the resignation of Chas. E. Johnson.

On motion the Board approved the purchase of a filing cabinet for the home demonstration agent.

of the gospel. They decided their own leaders, Barnabas and Saul, were the logical ones to go as the first Christian missionaries. After holding a service of consecration, they sent out these two fine men from among their midst.

From here on out, the name of Barnabas fades from the record but the name of Saul, or Paul, begins to shine, only to grow brighter and brighter as the years passed. Tradition has it that Barnabas "became a Bishop of Milan, preached in Rome, converted Clement and died a martyr in Cyprus." We do not know how true this is but we know that Barnabas remained true to the end, esteeming Christ of greater value than his own personal interests.
