In this connection, it is interesting to speculate whether the President responsible for the remodeling—Mr. Truman—will be permitted to enjoy the modern conveniences of the new White House for any considerable period of time. Present estimates call for the Truman family's removal from Plair House, across the street, to the White House in April. If this schedu'e is met, the President will have only nine months of assured occupancy since his present term expires in January, 1953.

If the President runs and is elected again, he will, of course, be the resident in the White House for another four years. In his current term, howfour years. In his current term, however, he lived in the White House only a few weeks after the 1948 election and will live in it only about nine months between April, and January, 1953. Whatever else he has done, Mr. Truman has provided a modern comfortable home for the next President of the United States, even if it is not himself.




