# TO THE PEOPLE OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY

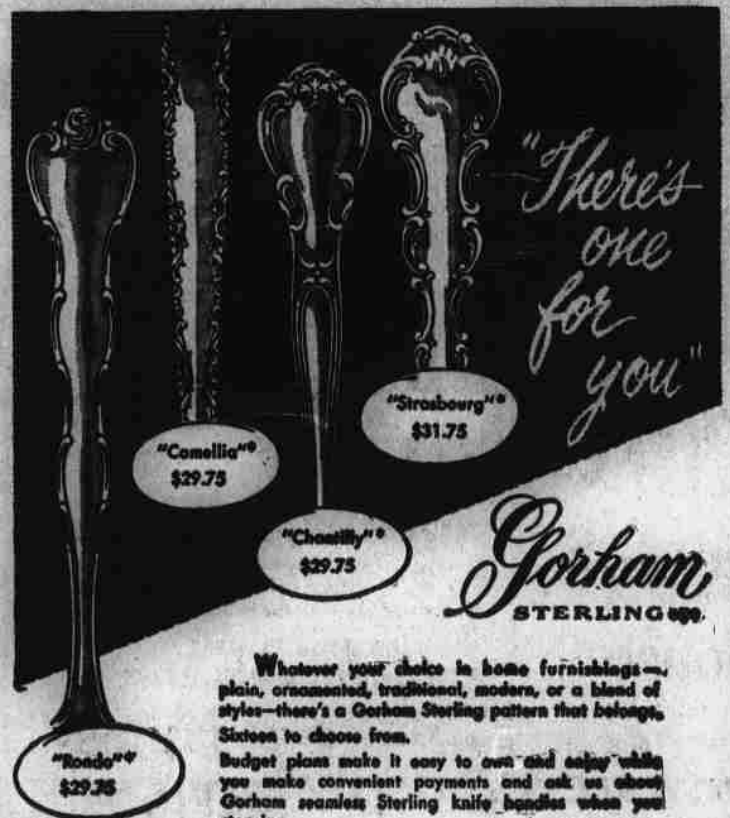
As a candidate for the office of Register of Deeds, for Perquimans County, I earnestly solicit your support and vote in behalf of my candidacy in the primary May 31.
