

## Productivity Is Now Highest On Record

The productiveness of American individual initiative and private enterprise, as measured by output per man hour, has been showing a much greater rate of increase in the last few years than ever before, according to estimates made by the Joint Congressional Committee on the Economic Report.

A major factor in this development, so basic to the progress of the economy and to the rise in living standards, has been the great amount of new industrial plant and equipment installed since the end of World War II.

As against the long-term rate of gain of about 2 per cent per year in output per man hour in the past productivity was estimated to have increased more than 5 per cent a year in 1950 and 1951, and the increase for 1952 is expected to be nearly as much. A lower rate of growth is anticipated for the years 1953 through 1955, but thanks to the better plants and tools the country now has, output per man hour is still expected to remain above the long-term annual average.
