A—Fire Prevention Week, Oct.
5-11, is sponsored by the National Fire Protection Association, a non-profit, technical and educational organization.

Q—What is the purpose of a "fire-stop" in a wall?

A—A fire-stop consists of non-combustible material with which a wall is filled at each floor level. The purpose is to prevent the spread of fire from one floor to another.

Q-What fire prevention measures can I take to keep flames from spreading to my house if a peighbor's home burns?


