Deep Freeze Surgery

Recently, doctors at the University of Minnesota performed an intricate heart operation by "deep-freezing" the patient and temporarily stopping the flow of blood. The flow was stopped for five and a half minutes, long enough for the surgeons to sew up a hole in the patient's heart.

Afterwards, one of the doctors predicted that refrigeration might be the answer to the "search for a method to work inside a bloodless heart." Another said he believed the operation was "the first time refrigeration had been used to perform cardiac surgery."

Dr. Floyd Lewis, 36, who was in charge of the operation, also believes the operation may open a new avenue to heart surgery—which has long been one of the most difficult of all operations.

Parents Grade Teachers

The State of Michigan is experimenting with a novel idea in the field of public education. The school teachers are being given report cards on which their work has been graded. The parents are grading the teachers!

Dr. Lee M. Thurston, state superintendent of public instruction, believes that the grading will result "in a better school system as a natural consequence if intelligently pursued." And, incidentally, the schools and the teachers are making a passing grade.

The parents do not feel, however, that the schools are doing much in helping their children to develop politeness. More than 75 per cent of the parents think that there is not enough vocational education in the schools, and they are willing to pay higher taxes, if that be necessary to get more vocational training.

Very few of the parents felt that learning to drive a car was of major importance. Yet three out of four thought that teachers' salaries were too low to attract well-prepared and conscientious teachers, or to hold good teachers.

Parents were asked this question: "Are today's youngsters who have finished school as well educated as those you knew when you were a child?" By a vote of more than three-to-one, parents voted that children today are at least as well educated as they were in the old days.

Communism In The Philippines

Philippine Defense Secretary Ramon Magsaysay recently told the Southeast Asia Veterans Conference, in Manila, that the government of the Philippines had "stopped the enemy's advance and turned the tide, and now has him squirming to survive." Mr. Magsaysay was referring to the Communist underground movement in the Philippines.

His statement is encouraging, because only a year ago, the Communist threat in the Philippines appeared to be a real one. The statement was also made at an opportune time, since the Southeast Asia Veterans Conference in Manila was the first meeting of its kind in that part of the world—the purpose being to exchange views on how to beat Communism.

Said Mr. Magsaysay, on the Communist movement in the Philippines: "Today we can report that Communists' military effort is demoralized and broken, his raids reduced to only occasional sorties in desperate search for goods and supplies, and confined to isolated places." No doubt, this was encouraging to delegations from Indo-China, Thailand, and the Malay States.

It is interesting to note that the success in the Philippines came about after U. N. forces took up the fight against Communism in Korea. It will be recalled that the willingness of the democracies to throw force into an active military battle hastened anti-Communists all over the Far East. And, with the Philippines apparently safe, it may not be too much to hope that the threat will be checked in other Far Eastern danger spots. At least, it is accurate to say that the hope today is a brighter one than it has been for some time.
