Where this "Marker" is located:
"John Harvey—5 times speaker of Colonial Assembly. Moderator of provincial Congress, 1774-1775. Leader of Revolutionary Movement. Lived 11-H South."

And this one:
Edmundson-Memorial? Near this spot William Edmundson, an English friend, held in May 1672, the first religious service on record in North Carolina. Six months later, George Fox, founder of The Religious Society of Friends, also visited this section and held meetings among the Colonists. Here were the beginnings of the religious life of a Great State. Erected June 11th, 1929 by the N. C. Yearly Meeting of Friends.

Did you know that the oldest deed on record in North Carolina is in the Court House in Hertford, N. C.? This deed was made to George Durant for a large tract of land near the mouth of Perquimans River and bordering on the Albemarle Sound, known as "Durant's Neck" by Kikocanen, an Indian Chief, dated March 1, 1661?

Do you know where the monument is, bearing this inscription—"They fought for what they believed to be right, and sealed this faith in blood?"
