NANCY CARTER Tested RECIPES

SWISS STEAK ROYAL

2 pounds Choice of Prime or Beefsteak
2 small onions, cut 1 inch thick
1 cup flour
2 cups sliced onion
2 tablespoons fat
2 tablespoons dry mustard

2 tablespoons salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 clove garlic, finely chopped
1/4 cup water
1/2 cup chili sauce or CS canned tomatoes

Place four hole steak with a meat hammer or edge of heavy mallet. Lightly press dry mixture in hot fat in a skillet. Remove from pan. Brown steak on both sides. Cover with onion. Mix remaining ingredients and pour over steak. Cover. Cook over low heat or bake in moderate oven, 300 degrees, about 1 1/2 hours, or until fork tender. Slice 6 servings.
