CHEESE SUPPER DISH

1 cup rice
1/4 cup Triangle butter
1 cup grated sharp cheese
1/2 cup CS flour
1 cup hot milk
1 cup Redgate tomatoes, heated

1/4 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon EACH dry mustard, paprika, salt
Dash cayenne pepper
8 slices bacon, cooked

Cook rice. Melt butter in heavy pan. Add cheese; sprinkle flour on top. Cover. Cook over low heat until cheese has melted and bubbled through flour. Stir in milk. Add tomatoes mixed with soda and seasonings. Simmer until blended. Serve on hot rice; garnish with bacon. Makes 4 servings.
