Smith on U.S. Spies

General Walter Bedell Smith, the retiring chief of the Central Intelligence Agency, recently said the U. S. Intelligence Service was as good as any in the world, with the exception of that of the Soviet Union.

If General Smith's analysis is ar accurate one, it represents quite an achievement, since the United States did not maintain any sizeable espionage system before World War II. The Soviet Union's espionage system has been functioning for many years and the beginning of the Communist system in the United States took place many decades ago.

General Smith believes the Soviet advantage lies mainly in the fact that information is easily obtained in the United States, whereas U. S. spies have a difficult time inside the Iron Curtain gaining access to restricted information.
