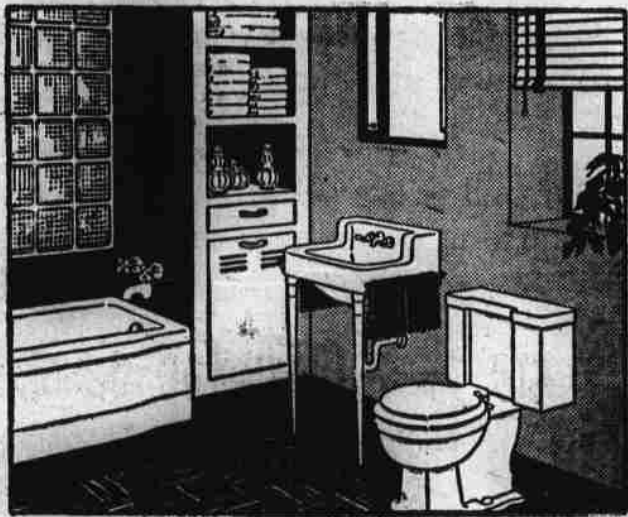

#### How To Roast An Easter Ham or Picnic

Place meat fat side up on a rack in a shallow pan. Use no water, no cover. Bake to 190 degree internal temperature as shown on meat thermometer (160 degrees if no glass is used). Remove skin and bones. Sweet Glazes For Toppings: Pour off drippings. Cut fat diagonally, 1/2 inch deep. Cover with one of these glazes.
