### Forger Apprehended By Sheriff M. G. Owens

Time usually catches up with a law-breaker.

In January, 1950, a man posing as A. J. Cox victimized four Hertford merchants by having them cash checks, which later proved to have been forged. Sheriff M. G. Owens began an investigation of the crime and he sought assistance from authorities at State Prison.

Information and a photo furnished the Sheriff led to the discovery that Cox whose real name is Ernest Jefferson was an inmate of the Hertford County prison camp, having been sentenced to the prison in February of 1950.

Sheriff Owens secured custody of the man, who confessed to his crimes here, and received prison sentences of from 3 to 3 years during the April term of Superior Court.

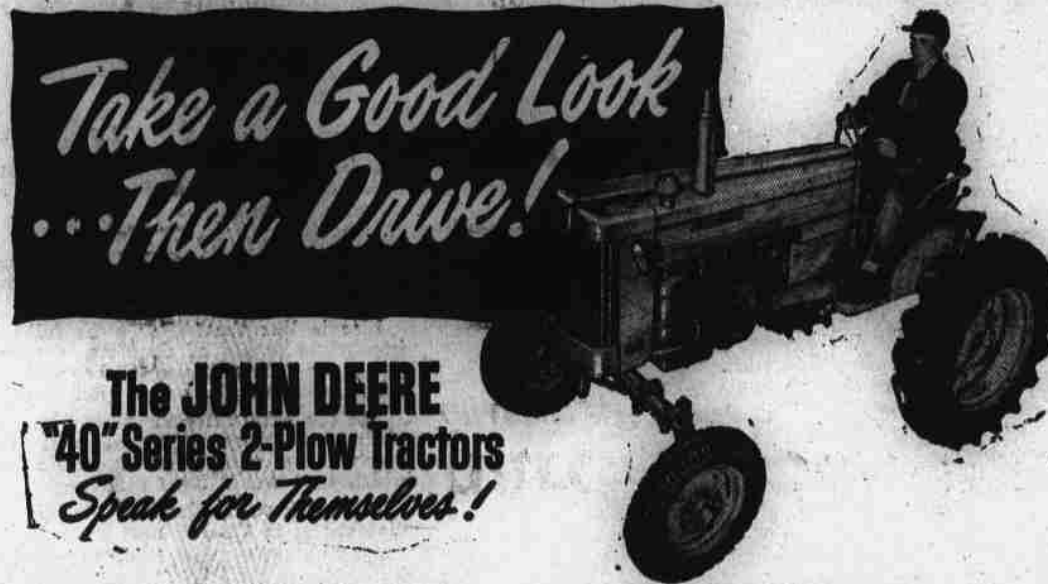
