DEVILED SALMON CASSEROLES
2 tall can Redgate salmon
2 Pick of the West eggs
2 tablespoons Triangle butter
2 tablespoons flour
About 1/2 cup milk
1 1/2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
1/4 cup bottled bread crumbs
Drain salmon, saving liquid; break fish into flake, removing bones. Hard-cook, peel and chop eggs. Melt butter; blend in flour. Add milk to the salmon liquid to make 1 cup. Add to flour mixture; cook over low heat until thickened and smooth, stirring constantly. Add all ingredients, except crumbs, to sauce. Mix well; put into individual, well-greased casseroles. Sprinkle crumbs on top. Bake in moderate oven, 375 degrees, about 30 minutes or until browned. Make 4 servings.
