NANCY CARTER'S RECIPES

Salted Peanut Cooking
(wonderful for plants and only fat)

| | |
|--------------------------|-------------------------------------|
| 1 cup hard or shortening | 1 teaspoon salt |
| 1 cup granulated sugar | 1 1/2 cups sifted all purpose flour |
| 1 cup dark brown sugar | 3 eggs (beaten) |
| 1 teaspoon vanilla | 1/2 pound salted peanuts |
| 3 Pick of the West eggs | |

Dream hard: add sugars gradually and continue creaming. Add vanilla and beaten eggs; beat thoroughly. Mix with the flour and add to first mixture; stir in until well combined; mix well. Press into small balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake in a hot oven (375°) about 12 minutes or until light brown. Bake 4 balls on each sheet. 2 inches in diameter.
