**FLORIDA LIME PIE**

4 tablespoons cornstarch, 1 tablespoon grated Butter  
1/2 cup sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 1/2 cups water, 6 tablespoons fresh lime juice  
3 Pick of the Neat Eggs

Blend cornstarch, sugar and salt in top of double boiler; stir in water. Cook over direct heat, stirring constantly until mixture is very thick and transparent. Place over hot water; cover and cook 15 minutes. Separate eggs; beat yolks; add hot mixture, stirring rapidly. Return to double boiler and cook over hot water 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, stir in butter, lime rind and juice. Turn into baked pie shell; top with meringue. Bake in moderate oven, 375 degrees, 15 to 18 minutes. Cool away from drafts. Make 6 servings.

**REBLENDE:** Beat the 3 egg whites until they form rounded peaks when beater is withdrawn. Then gradually add 6 tablespoons sugar, beating constantly until mixture is stiff and glossy. Place on pie.
