What Do You Know About Motor Vehicle Laws?

Are there any specific rules covering so routine a maneuver as passing another car?

It so happens there are. The Motor Vehicle Manual points out that motorists overtaking and passing another vehicle shall pass at least two feet to the left, and not return to the right side of the highway until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle. You must sound your horn too, when passing another vehicle on the open highway.

USDA Reports Indicate Onions On Plentiful List

Do you realize that the American persons eats an average of ten pounds of onions each year and that he's been consuming this amount every year since 1935? It's true, claim U. S. Department of Agriculture specialists.

And this Fall, the homemaker who buys foods in season will be finding new ways to serve onions since the late onion crop this Fall is the second largest on record—prices are low and quality is high, say State College nutritionists.

When looking for dry onions, choose those that are bright, clean, hard, well-shaped and those with dry skins. In selecting green onions, pick those that are young, crisp, tender, have fresh green tops, medium-sized necks and are white two or three inches from the root.

To store dry onions, place them at room temperature or slightly cooler (60 to 70 degrees Fahrenheit).

Generally onions are used as seasonings, but this year since the quality is so high and the supply so plentiful, the wise homemaker may want to change her cooking practices to utilize more onions. She can serve onions boiled, creamed, stuffed, fried, or scalloped with nuts and apples, for example. Boiled sliced onions make a delicious garnish for meat loaf, and

of course, batter-dipped fried onions are a favorite accompaniment for broiled liver.

Onion soup will taste mighty good these crisp Fall days. Simply cook 1½ cups finely chopped onion in 2 tablespoons butter until lightly browned. Blend in 2 tablespoons flour. Add 1 quart hot beef broth and stir until smooth. Add salt and pepper. Top each bowlful with grated cheese.

Operation Christmas Week November 10-21

Governor William B. Umstead has officially set aside November 10-21 as Operation Christmas Week. The Governor asked the delegates to express his appreciation to General Timberlake and Mr. Ochsenreiter for making Operation Christmas possible again this year. The project is now in its fourth year. It provides holiday cheer for more than 5,000 children in North Carolina orphan and child care homes. Funds for the project are being raised through donation at Pope Air Force Base and a series of benefits held by the Jaycees in ten cities during Operation Christmas Week.

Earl O. Shreve New Savings Bonds Director

Chief Justice Warren of the U. S. Supreme Court Wednesday of last week administered the oath of office to Earl O. Shreve of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, as National Director of the United States Savings Bonds Division of the Treasury Department.

Earl O. Shreve was sworn in as the new National Director of the U. S. Savings Bonds Division of the Treas-

ury Department at a colorful ceremony in room 4121, Main Treasury Building. The oath of office was administered in the presence of Secretary of the Treasury George M. Humphrey and other Treasury and Savings Bond officials.

New Pension Plans Approved Set Record

More private pension and profit-sharing plans were given the green light in the year ended last June 30 than in any recent year, according to figures of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service.

The Bureau reported that it ruled favorably on 3,780 such plans submitted for approval in this period as compared with 2,493 rulings in the year ended June 30, 1952, and 1,987 in the previous fiscal year.

The latest estimates are that more than 10 million workers are covered

under private pension and profit-sharing plans. There are now around 21,000 such plans in operation, with some \$11 billions of accumulated funds; and they are growing at an estimated rate of nearly \$2 billions a year.

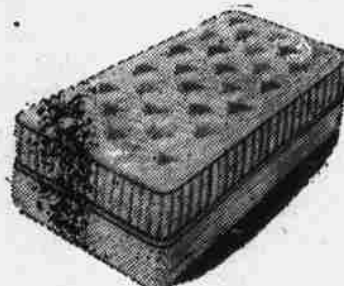

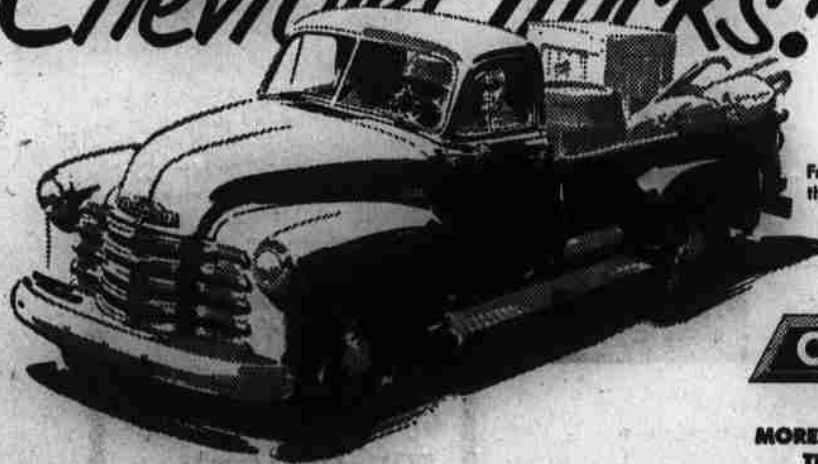
