How To Bake A Ham: Place meat fat side up on a rack in a shallow pan. Use no water, no cover. Bake to 150 degrees internal temperature as shown on meat thermometer (162 degrees if no glaze is used). Remove skin and glaze.

Sweet Glazes For Topping: Pour off drippings. Cut fat diagonally, 1/4 inch deep. Cover with one of these glazes. Return to 400 degree oven, 15 minutes.

- 1 cup sifted brown sugar mixed with 2 table-spoons flour.
- 1 cup sifted brown sugar mixed with 1 tablespoon dry mustard.
- 1/2 cup orange, peach or apricot marmalade.
- 3/4 cup CS crushed pineapple and 1 cup sifted brown sugar.
- 1/2 cup honey.
