JAPANESE FRUIT CAKE
2/3 cup Triangle Butter
1/2 cup sugar
2 eggs
1/2 cup of the best egg
cup sifted cake flour
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
1/2 cup chopped pecans
1/2 cup butterfat
1/8 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon each Citroness, Almonds, nutmeg
2/3 teaspoon soda
1/2 cup buttermilk
Cream butter and sugar thoroughly. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each. Use 1/2 cup flour to mix with butter and soda. Mix remaining flour, salt, nutmeg, and soda together. Add to first mixture alternately with buttermilk. Mix in relative and soda. Turn into 2 1/2 inch paper-lined cake pans. Bake in slow oven, 175 degrees, about 1 hour. (Small cake leaves sides of pan. Fill as above, but cover with some of 1/2 cup flour as with 1/2 cup soda.)
FILLING - Combine 2 cans coconut (drained of water or sugar), 1 1/2 cups cream, 1/2 tablespoon each vanilla and salt and 1/2 teaspoon 1/2 cup butter. Mix well, cook until very thick. Cool before using.
