Chairman Calls For Xmas Seal Reports

J. W. Ward, chairman of the Perquimans County Christmas Seal campaign, today issued a final appeal to county residents for funds to support the District TB Association, which is carrying out a splendid program in combatting Tuberculosis.

The chairman called attention to the fact that the campaign will close Christmas Day, and as yet, there are a number of individuals who have not returned contributions for seals mailed out the latter part of November. He urges those individuals to mail in their contributions as soon as possible in order that the county committee can ascertain the success of the drive.

Reports received thus far indicate that local residents have responded splendidly to the appeal for funds used to fight tuberculosis and the committee is hopeful that this year's drive will be the best ever conducted. A final report on the sale of Christmas Seals will be made by the chairman shortly after the drive closes and the committee has had an opportunity to tabulate all of the returns.

Holidays Hold Added Danger For Children

Holidays can be danger days for the youngsters. The menace is fire. Actually, fire is a year-round threat to children—their No. 1 killer in home accidents. But at this time of year, added seasonal hazards increase the danger. Excited and over-tired youngsters are especially vulnerable to the dangers of loosely woven costumes and party dresses, decorative candles and unsafe toys.

Protect them advises the National Board of Fire Underwriters, by following these simple fire safety suggestions:

1. Flameproof children's clothing made of loosely woven materials. Dip such garments in a solution of 9 ounces of borax and 4 ounces of boric acid to a gallon of water. Wring by hand, then hang to dry. Flameproofing will last until the clothes are laundered; then it must be repeated. Use it on doll's clothes, too, as well as adults' clothing, drapes or any washable fabric.
2. Remember, candles are dangerous at any time—but particularly when there are children around. Electric candles are just as effective in decorating, and much safer.
3. When buying electrical toys of any type, always look for the UL label. It means the toys have passed Underwriter's Laboratories tests for fire and shock hazards. As an added safety measure, supervise play with even safe electrical toys.
4. Some types of toys, such as those involving flame or pressure, should not be given to little children. Others, such as chemical sets, should be selected with care, and play with them should be supervised.
5. Never leave children at home alone!

Last year, nearly 1,300 children under 5 years old were killed by fire. Deaths among the 5-14 age group brought the total up to 1,700. In this season, in any season, keep the children safe.
