

## Lennon Reports On Senate Seniority

Senator Alton A. Lennon today issued the following statement regarding seniority in the U. S. Senate:

"The purpose of this statement is to clarify my position with respect to my successor's seniority in the United States Senate.

"No committee seniority can now be or could have been gained by Senator-Elect W. Kerr Scott by my resignation from the United States Senate.

"Mr. Scott cannot gain committee seniority by appointment as the earliest Democrats who can be seated under existing regulations are Senators-Elect O'Mahoney of Wyoming, and Bible of Nevada. They will not take their seats until around December 1. My successor, Mr. Scott, will become eligible to be seated after he is certified under North Carolina law on November 23rd, putting him in the Senate well ahead of any other newly elected Democrat, thereby giving him seniority over them, which is the basis for assignment to Senate Committees. He will have seniority over the two above-mentioned Senators as well as the following: Senators-Elect Newberger of Oregon; McNamara of Michigan; Thurman of South Carolina; and Barkley of Kentucky, all of whom will go in office in January.

"Governor Scott will be eligible, according to North Carolina law, to take his seat in the Senate on November 23rd, the date he is officially certified as having been elected to the Senate for the short term, and my tenure of office will expire at the time he presents his credentials which I hope he will do immediately upon being certified."
