PRIZE WINNING CHERRY PIE
1 can (19 oz.) CS and sour 1/2-teaspoon red food coloring
1 cup sugar 1/2-teaspoon almond extract
1 1/2-teaspoons all-purpose flour 1/2-teaspoon Thymol (antibiotic)
1/4-teaspoon salt 1/4-teaspoon nutmeg
Drain cherries thoroughly. (Use 1/2-cup juice saved in dessert base. Do not use if you have a nut allergy.) Mix sugar, flour and salt; save 1/2-teaspoon of this to sprinkle on bottom crust before putting in filling. Add cherries, coloring, extract and butter to flour mixture. Let stand while crust is prepared. Mix pie shell according to your favorite recipe or package directions. Line 9" or 9 1/2" pie plate with filling and cover with top crust. Bake in a hot oven, 425 degrees, 20 to 40 minutes. Slice 1 1/2 or 2-inch pie.
