Home News

Many people think of brown as a predominate color in dried flower arrangements, but you can have yellows, greens, reds, blacks and whites. Wild flowers, grasses, berries and seed pods may also be used. It is time to begin saving materials in order to have attractive arrangements next Fall, Gather flowers and strip off all the leaves. Bunch them together without letting the heads touch and hang upside down in a dark, dry place. The time required for drying varies from a few days to several weeks. Flowers may also be dried by the borax method. After the loaves are arranged the flowers are placed upside down in enough borax to cover them. Be careful not to let the flower heads touch each other. Look at these flowers every two or three days and when they are dry remove from the ened brush and hang upside down
