

Health Department Program to Reduce VD Is Continuous

A continued program designed to reduce venereal disease in the local four-county Health District is being offered, Dr. B. B. McGuire, Health Officer for the four counties reports.

Dr. McGuire said that venereal disease control is a responsibility of the medical profession, the health department and the general public and said that cooperation between all three is necessary if control is to be achieved.

All persons suffering from venereal disease who are able to pay their physician are expected to take adequate treatment from him. However, the Health Department is held liable by law to treat all patients who are unable or unwilling to pay private physicians.

At the end of the fiscal year 1934, federal funds were withdrawn for the purpose of paying full time V. D. investigators for many districts throughout the state, including the local Health District.

It is her duty to determine through personal interview at clinics and at the homes of patients, the answer to two vital questions: from whom has this patient had an opportunity to get this disease, and to whom has the patient had an opportunity to transmit the disease?

At the present time there are approximately 75 persons under treatment and observation in the local Health Department, the majority being in the Negro race.

Each year when the migratory workers enter our counties, all members of each labor camp are blood tested and given necessary treatment by the local Health Department, assisted by a team of workers sent in by the United States Public Health Service, thus helping to control these diseases in other states.

Weekly venereal disease clinics are held each Tuesday night from 8:30 P. M. until 7:00 P. M. in Elizabeth City, each Thursday night from 5:00 P. M. until 7:00 P. M. in Hertford, and each Friday afternoon from 2:30 until 3:30 in Edenton.
