Change Indicated In Corn Acreage

Reports from North Carolina farmers on 1955 prospective plantings indicate that 2,085,000 acres of corn will be planted. A crop of this size would be 4 per cent less than the 2,172,000 acres planted in 1954 and 7 per cent less than the 1944-54 average plantings of 2,-233,000 acres.

Corn acreage allotments are in effect in 23 eastern North Carolina counties this year. The 1955 acreage allotment in counties with allotments in both 1954 and 1955, is about 10 per cent above last year.

March indications point to a total U. S. planted corn acreage of 82.033,000 acres. This is about the same as the 1954 planted acreage of 81,893,000 acres, but is 5 per continue service to boxes for which cent less than the 1944-53 average planted acreage.


