

Rotary Conference At Durham Sunday

Rotarians from Rotary International District 278 will gather in Durham March 27-28 for their annual conference. District 278 embraces clubs in the northeastern section of North Carolina, from Burlington to Manteo, and includes the Rotary Club of Hertford. Egbert N. Peeler of Raleigh is Governor.

Principal speakers for the conference will be Karl Knapp of Pittsburgh, Pa., special representative of Rotary International President Herb Taylor; Jennings Randolph, former Congressman and now assistant to the president of Capital Airlines; and Dr. Pierce

Harris, renowned minister of the First Methodist Church at Atlanta, Ga.

The conference will formally begin on Sunday evening, March 27, with the Golden Anniversary Dinner at which Knapp will speak. The schedule for Monday includes a breakfast for incoming officers, a plenary session at which the District Governor for 1955-56 will be elected, and a luncheon at which Randolph will speak. A second plenary session will be held in the afternoon with the Governor's Banquet, at which Dr. Harris will speak, concluding the conference.

Candidates for the post of District Governor are Matthew J. Bird of Wilson, Joel Cook Holland of Murfreesboro, and H. Broadus Jones of Wake Forest.

Purpose of the District Conference is to review the service work of the clubs in the district and to plan ways of increasing the effectiveness of their future activities. District 278 is one of the 200 districts in Rotary International which now includes 8,300 clubs in 89 countries and geographical regions. A. W. Hefren, president elect of the Hertford Club, has been designated as delegate to represent the local club at the annual conference.

P. O. Box Rental Rules Explained

White, Hertford Postmaster, today called to the attention of box holders of the local Post Office that quarterly rental fees must be paid and reported prior to the close of business on March 31. He pointed out the postal regulations require postmasters to discontinue service to boxes for which rent has not been paid, and henceforth these rules will be strictly observed.

Mr. White also commended residents of rural routes, served by the Hertford carriers, for compliance with the recent ruling making it mandatory for mail boxes to be placed on the right side of highways. He reported patrons of the local post office have cooperated on this rule almost 100 per cent.

Change Indicated In Corn Acreage

Reports from North Carolina farmers on 1955 prospective plantings indicate that 2,085,000 acres of corn will be planted. A crop of this size would be 4 per cent less than the 2,172,000 acres planted in 1954 and 7 per cent less than the 1944-54 average plantings of 2,233,000 acres.

Corn acreage allotments are in effect in 23 eastern North Carolina counties this year. The 1955 acreage allotment in counties with allotments in both 1954 and 1955, is about 10 per cent above last year.

March indications point to a total U. S. planted corn acreage of 82,033,000 acres. This is about the same as the 1954 planted acreage of 81,893,000 acres, but is 5 per cent less than the 1944-53 average planted acreage.

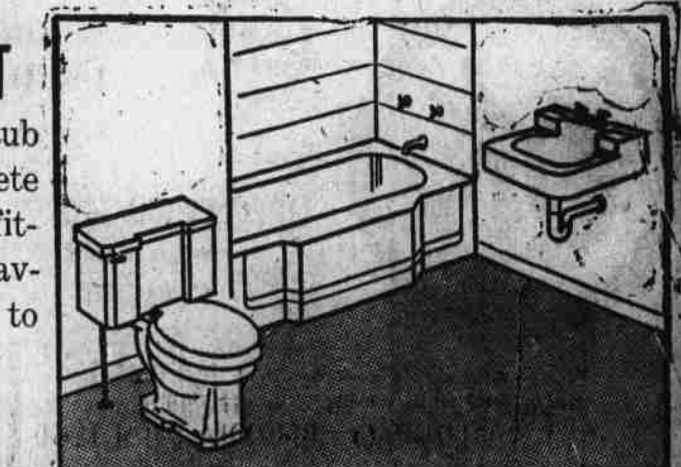
