

# 350 Farmers Paid \$24,051 For Soil Practises In 1954

Perquimans County farmers were paid \$24,051.80 during 1954 for carrying out soil conservation practices under the Agricultural Conservation program, it was revealed in the audit report for the Perquimans ASC released last Saturday by the County Committee.

The total payments were made to 350 farmers for carrying out practices on 328 farms; the farmers in turn matched this amount with their own funds in carrying out the program.

Funds paid out under this program, the report stated, are appropriated by Congress and allocated to states and counties. 1954 Conservation Practices for which assistance was given in this county through ACP included pastures, water cover crops, small grain and open permanent ditch drainage.

The soil and water conservation practices most needed on farms in Perquimans County were selected from the State list of practices by the County ASC Committee, assisted by the Soil Conservation Department, Farmers Home Administration and Extension Service.

One of the chief duties, performed in 1954 by community committees for the program the report added, was the making of a survey of farms in the county to obtain the history of corn planted on all farms for the purpose of establishing corn allotments.

During the year 1954 crops under marketing quotas were cotton, peanuts and wheat. Allotments on wheat were made to 22 farms consisting of 150 acres; for peanuts allotments were for 570 farms for a total of 3544.8 acres, and for cotton, number of farms were 592 with total acreage 2030.3.
