2 1/2 to 3-lb. tender fryer cut up  
2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup teaspoon pepper  
1 cup flour  
1/2 cup shortening  
12 small whole onions  
1 lb. sliced mushrooms (or 1 4-oz. can)  
2 minced chives garlic  
1 cup Triangle butter  
2 cup water  
4 fresh tomatoes quartered

Dip chicken in mixed salt, pepper and flour. Brown in shortening fry slowly until tender. Boil onions until tender, drain. In another skillet combine onion, mushrooms, garlic and butter. Cook covered 10 minutes, stir after. Add 2 tablespoons flour and remaining ingredients, cook until thickened. Cover and cook 10 minutes longer. Season. Pour over hot chicken. Make four servings.
