S. Supreme Court, Folger Shakespeare Library, Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Department of Interior Museum, Corcoran Gallery of Art, DAP Museum, Pan American Union, White House, Washington Cathedral, National Zoological Park, Mount Vernon, to mention some of the interesting places.

The best time to travel around Washington is after 9:00 A. M., and before 4:30 P. M. You will avoid the heavy traffic which is certainly a headache during the rush hours.
