Student Hurt In Accident Tuesday

Tommy Stanton, 14-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Stanton of Winfall, sustained a broken arm and numerous bruises and abrasions about 1 P. M., Tuesday when he was struck by a pickup truck on grounds at Perquimans High School in Hertford.

He was admitted to the Albemarle Hospital where officials reported Wednesday morning that the youth also sustained rib injuries.

According to Supt. J. T. Biggers of Perquimans schools, the youth was chasing another boy when he darted across the street from between parked buses. The fender of the state-owned truck struck young Stanton, knocking him to the ground.

W. O. (Red) Elliott, head mechanic for the county's school buses, was driving the truck, Biggers said. He was returning to the school garage from lunch when the accident occurred.

Several eye witnesses to the incident said that there was no way Elliott could have avoided striking Stanton with the quickness with which he moved into the truck's path. Only the headlight of the vehicle was damaged.

Biggers said medical bills will be paid by an insurance company which covers all school children during their stay at school.
