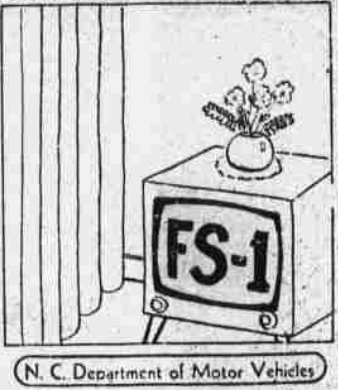
BRIDGE CLUB MEETS
