Officials Have Suspicion That Many Tar Meets Driving With Improper Licenses

Motor Vehicles Department officials have a strong suspicion that too many Tar Meets are driving with improper driver licenses. Elton R. Peele, chief of the agency's driver licensing division declared that the present rate of license renewals was "entirely out of line."

The vehicles official said that normally 25,000 to 30,000 renewals a month are handled by examiners over the state. "This rate not only has fallen off," he warned, "but examiners report an increasing number of applicants who show up with expired licenses."

State law requires the renewal of driver licenses every four years. "While this requirement is generally known," Peele said, "figures show too many drivers are either forgetting to renew or deliberately avoiding it."

"In either case, driving with an expired license is in definite violation of the law and the problem is serious." Peele cited renewal figures for last year as an example of the sharp decline. He said that only 228,156 drivers in 1958 came to have their licenses renewed at the proper time, compared with 255,282 the previous year.

"This difference of more than 27,000 applicants is a certain sign that something's wrong," Peele said. "We can offer no explanation for the decrease other than the fact that people simply are not renewing at the proper time."

The licensing official hinted that perhaps sterner enforcement measures may provide a solution. He reminded motorists that the State Highway Patrol makes frequent spot checks to insure compliance with the driver license law.

"Possibly we will confer with Highway Patrol Commander J. R. Smith and see if even more frequent inspections can't be made," Peele said. "In Winston-Salem recently, city police made such a formula work. Following an announcement that every local driver's license would shortly be inspected, the rate of renewals in our office there jumped astonishingly."

Peele urged every Tar Meel driver to self-inspect his license before the police do. "Check your license frequently," he cautioned, "and make certain it has not expired or is about to expire."
