structed 17,700 feet of main and lateral ditches moving 19,128 cubic yards of dirt and 15,142 feet of field ditches moving 1,597 cubic yards of dirt. Their arms do not look like the same land now, as they have long rows and the land looks higher since the ditches were cut.

Local ASC and SCS officials after reviewing the project have stated that this is an excellent example of farmers cooperating among themselves and with the Federal government to overcome their overall conservation problem. They have ignored farm boundaries in the same way that run-off water ignores such arbitrary lines. A drainage outlet serving each farmer in the group was constructed through several farms to a natural drainage outlet.

These ditches were surveyed, designed and the construction checked by local Soil Conservation Service technicians working with the Albemarle Soil Conservation District.

MENINGITIS FACTS

tuted early. Epidemiological studies around a case of meningococcal infection are usually unsatisfactory in these times. Seldom can a chain of infection be defined. Most infections are either asymptomatic or so mild that medical attention is not sought, the infection so severe as to attract medical care being unusual. However, these may be so fulminating that unless medical aid is quickly obtained, death ensues in a matter of several hours.

The most recent case of meningitis was due to a streptococcus, the same kind of germ which causes scarlet fever or septic sore throat. It is a rather uncommon type of meningitis, and the same precautions

are observed that are used for scarlet fever. It is hoped that this explanation will convey to the public the when a case of meningitis is followed.

While all types of meningitis are of major importance as far as the patient is concerned, epidemiologically the meningococcal spinal meningitis is the type in which the most rigid quarantine procedures are carried out.
