A lady from Edenton writes—  
"My peonies do not bloom as they should. Can you give me information, etc." This may be a good time to discuss peonies because others may have a problem.  
Peony clumps usually increase in size and the flowers in beauty for a good many years after planting. However, the clumps should be divided when the flowers diminish in size and number.  
In late summer when the tops begin to show decline, cut the stems back to about six inches, and carefully dig the entire root clump with a space. (This decline usually occurs about October 1 in eastern Carolina and the middle of September in the

mountains).  
Carefully shake soil from the roots or wash with a hose. At the base of the stems, you will find "eyes" or buds. Be very careful not to injure these because this is where growth for your new plants will be initiated.  
Carefully divide the clumps, by sectioning with a sharp knife, and save about four buds on each section. Transplant immediately in holes large enough to accommodate the root clump without crowding and deep enough so that the buds will be two inches below the ground level when the hole is filled. Cut the stems off with a sharp knife, and this will help prevent disease.  
Before filling the hole, thor-

oughly mix about a good handful of 8-8-8 fertilizer (not pelletized) with the soil.

MINUTES OF MEETING BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Perquimans County Board of Education met in special session Thursday, June 11, 1959. Mr. Caddy was absent.  
Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.  
Mr. Silas Whedbee, attorney, and Mr. Griffith, architect, met with the board to discuss a proposal made by Mr. Godwin, attorney for the estate of the late Mr. Pierce. Mr. Godwin proposed for the estate a cash settlement of \$1,000.00 for a final release from any further responsibility in connection with the electrical contract at Hertford Grammar School. After much discussion, a motion was made, seconded and passed authorizing Mr. Biggers, Superintendent, and Mr. Griffith, architect, to make a counter proposal to Mr. Godwin, with authority to accept a final settlement.  
Upon motion by Mr. Eure seconded by Mr. Matthews, a resolution of assignment of Perquimans County School pupils was passed. Copy of resolution to become a part of these minutes.  
The District School Committee met with the board for the purpose of studying all applications for the Perquimans Union School principalship. After studying each application thoroughly, the school committee elected Joseph Dempsey as principal of Perquimans Union School for the school year 1959-1960. Upon motion duly made and seconded the board of education approved the election of Joseph Dempsey.  
After discussing the supervisory program for 1959-1960, motion was made, seconded and passed elected Miss Margaret Mullen as County Supervisor of Schools for 1959-1960.  
The following teachers, having been elected by the school committee, were approved for the school year 1959-1960: Mrs. Janet Walker, English at Perquimans High School; Mrs. Janet Weathersby and Mrs. Audrey Roach, Perquimans Central Grammar School.  
The Superintendent reported that foundation for the two rooms at Perquimans Union School had been poured and that work was proceeding according to schedule.

**AN ORDINANCE REGARDING DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE AT NIGHT IN THE TOWN OF HERTFORD.**

(2) Each qualified child, not heretofore attending a school in this county, who attended the preschool clinic held in this county, is hereby assigned to the school whose clinic said child attended.  
(3) All children not covered by sections 1 and 2 will be assigned for school year 1959-60 to a school upon request for admission when received by the Board.

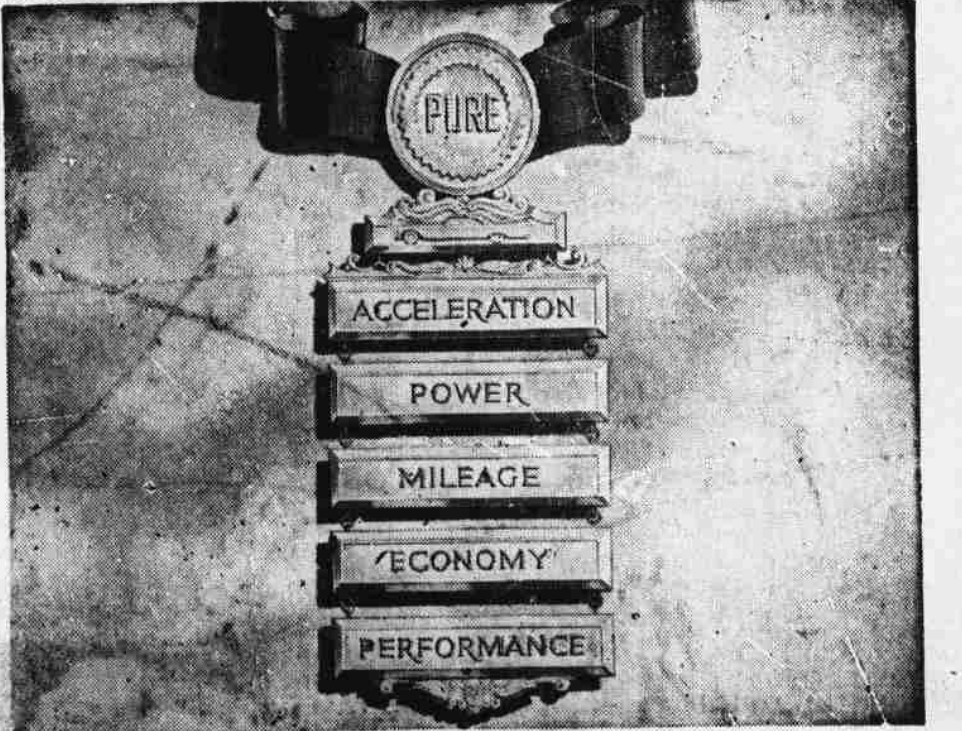
