**Values Change**

Faced with a state law, which now requires Perquimans County to hold a revaluation of property every eight years, the Board of Commissioners have completed arrangements to conduct this project immediately, and the work most likely will be under way within the next week.

Values of property change over a period of years, and because Perquimans County has not conducted a revaluation since 1927, the Legislature included the county among others which must complete the task by 1960.

In the opinion of experts, revaluation is simply a matter of appraising property on a fair and equal basis in regards to all property owners. These values can and do sometimes change; thus the state law which requires a county to do the program each eighth year in order to equalize such changes.

We are not experts on the procedure of revaluation but as we see it the program is merely an operation the result of which will mean each property owner will pay his or her fair share of taxation with the knowledge each one has been assessed on the same equal basis.

We have been asked how revaluation affects a tax rate. Since the tax rate is determined by the total amount of assessed property it boils down to the fact that the higher the valuation the lower the tax rate. This has been the effect in neighboring counties which completed revaluation during the past few years. In those counties the property valuation increased and the tax rate was lowered.

**A Crash Cancer Program**

Arthur Godfrey and Senator Richard L. Neuberger recently appealed for a "crash" program in the fight against cancer, before a Senate sub-committee. Both suggested that the crash program be inaugurated in honor of the late John Foster Dulles, who was a victim of that disease.

A crash program on cancer, as suggested, would be in order, and it is interesting to note that the chairman of the sub-committee, Senator Lister Hill (D-Ala.) welcomed the idea when it was suggested before his committee.

Cancer, of course, is not the greatest scourge on the health scene. However, it strikes with such rapidity, and so often among those who have just attained a high degree of value and training, that it robs the nation of many highly-gifted and needed men and women. The same is true about heart disease.

Mental disease, which exacts the biggest toll of all in the United States, is certainly worthy of everyone's attention, although readjustment and cure of this widespread disease has registered more progress in recent years than efforts to control or cure cancer.

**Sunday School Lesson**

**SERVE BY SHARING**

International Sunday School Lesson for June 21, 1958.

Memory Selection: "Take heed what you do, for there is no perversion of justice with the Lord our God, or partiality, or taking bribes." —(II Chronicles 19:7).

Lesson Text: II Chronicles 17: 19 and 20

This lesson is intended to show modern men that they are responsible to God in the administration of law so that justice may prevail.

In our Scriptures for today we see Jehoshaphat setting up a judicial system to administer guidance to his people in a fair and impartial manner, and charging his chosen ones to be honest in their decisions, and keep themselves pure in the eyes of the Lord by so doing. In other words, in order that the law might be taught to the people, the king appointed a team of teachers. Almost one-third of the team were laymen, and just two priests completed the roster; nine Levites, five laymen, and two priests. This commission traveled from place to place. They brought greater emphasis upon the importance of knowing the law. They spurred on the large body of teaching Levites throughout the country.

The vast teaching enterprise of the modern church uses many teams and an army of co-workers. There are many thousands of church-school teachers at work every Sunday morning, reaching the people of the church. And the church needs still more dedicated young men and women who will prepare themselves for leadership in higher education.

King Jehoshaphat was a good king, and lived righteously. Only three kings in Judean history are credited with lives of righteousness, and Jehoshaphat is one of them. His father had named him Jehoshaphat, a name meaning "God judges." The king lived up to the meaning of his name by making true justice available throughout the country, and by living according to the principles that as king he was subject to God's judgment. Perhaps his greatest strength was that he was able to share responsibility for the administration of his government. And the strength of the church lies in the same direction.

In studies that have been made across many denominations, it has been discovered that there is a direct relationship between shared responsibility and active membership in the church. Unless new members are put to work and given some responsibility they are likely to become inactive members within a year after becoming members. To sit as a passive listener carries little challenge to most people.

It has been charged that Americans would rather watch than participate, especially in sports. This may possibly be true, but the reverse is true in church and civic affairs. Unless there is active participation interest lags quickly.

How can we gain for the church the benefit of potential leadership that we know exists among our people? We should begin with people and their particular interests. Only too often, alas, we assume that people must do things our way, and they must fit into things as we have designed them. Instead, we should be guided by the people themselves. We may have been hoping to corral a particular person as treasurer for an organization, only to find that figures bore him. However, in talking with him, we may run across the "dearly suited to the job we have named of a man who would be in mind.

In an effort to share the work of the church on a fair basis, and thus keep everybody's interest alive in the work of the Lord on a sharing basis, some churches have kept a file of members' skills. Periodically, nominating committees go through the list and seek to put new people to work. Or other churches have ruled that there shall be a limit to the number of jobs any person is permitted to do. In this way a larger percentage of the church membership is kept actively at work. Still other churches make it a rule that periodically every worker shall take a rest. No person may hold office for more than three years in succession.
