

### Farmer's ASC Program Improves His Land

John L. Layden, owner and operator of a 250 acre farm in the Parkville section of Perquimans County, uses conservation practices offered through the Agricultural Conservation Program to conserve and improve his land.

Mr. Layden cultivates 159 acres with 15 acres in pasture. The ACP cost-sharing, I have established a winter cover crop of wheat and oats on approximately 20 acres each year since 1956," he said.

Mr. Layden said that he had used very few years in participating in the ACP since the program was made available to

farmers. "Assistance through ACP has helped me carry out practices I need to protect soil and water on my farm," he added. He has filed a request for cost-sharing and received approval to cut an open permanent drainage ditch on his farm this fall.

Mr. Layden says that he is an advocate of sowing winter cover crops for improving and conserving the soil and urges farmers in Parkville community to visit their ASC office in Hertford and take advantage of the opportunities offered under the ACP.

George Bellmon, Perquimans County ASC office manager, said that now is the time to file a request for assistance in carrying out approved conservation practice under the 1960 ACP. The sign-up period ends September 1, 1960. However, the ASC County Committee will consider requests filed after the sign-up period if funds are available.
