Allocation of \$7,356,135.97 in Powell Bill funds to 415 participating municipalities was an nounced Friday by the State Highway Department. The funds are distributed annually to qualified cities and towns for use in non-highway system street work within their corporate limits. Checks will be mailed from Raleigh the latter part of this month in order that they will reach municipalities by October 1.

The total allocation this year represents an increase over 1960 of \$337,234.25, but in the case of approximately 60% of the participating municipalities, this year's allocation will be less than the 1960 allocation.
